RRLC's 44th Annual Meeting

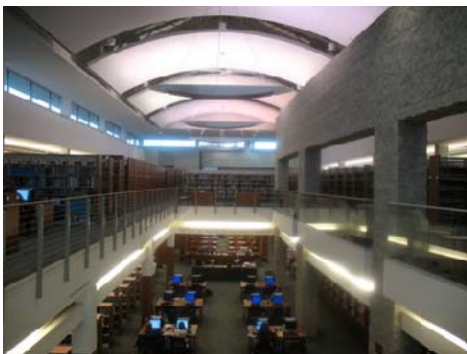
The 44th Annual Meeting of the Rochester Regional Library Council is Thursday, June 3 in the Vintage Room at Casa Larga. RRLC is excited to recognize the accomplishments of several member libraries and librarians at this year's meeting.



David Lindahl, Software Development Director at the University of Rochester Libraries, was named to the 2010 *Library Journal* list of Movers & Shakers. Lindahl was honored for his work on the University of Rochester's innovative open source catalog solution, the eX-tensible Catalog (better known as XC).

RRLC will also honor its three Library of the Year award winners. The libraries were nominated by their users, and the final decision was made by an independent panel of judges. Judges included children's author Ellen Stoll Walsh, 10NBC news reporter Nikki Rudd, and New York State Librarian Bernard Margolis.

The **Golisano Library at Roberts Wesleyan College** was the winner in the academic library category. Library director Al Krober and his staff will be present to accept their award.



Chili Public Library was the winner in the public library category. Library director Jeff Baker and many staff members will be on hand to receive their award.



The **Barclay School Library** at Brockport Central School was the winner in the school library category. Librarian Suzanne Shearman will attend, along with several of her Brockport library colleagues.

Serving the “unaffiliated”: RRLC Receives \$30,000 NN/LM Outreach Award

We teach students throughout their school careers and into college and even grad school to use quality information resources. Sometimes that is easy because school and academic libraries provide access to licensed resources that generally can be counted on to provide trustworthy information.

But what happens when the student graduates and gets that first job? Take the case of a nurse. If she isn't employed in a hospital or university medical center, the chances are that she will not have access to any licensed online resources – the ones we taught her to use in college.

RRLC has recognized this as a growing problem for nurses and other health care professionals, as more and more of our health care is handled in outpatient clinics or through home care nurses.

Through the National Network/Libraries of Medicine/Middle Atlantic Region, RRLC has been awarded an Outreach to Unaffiliated Health Professional award entitled, “Extending the Reach: Health Information Resources for Unaffiliated Health Professionals”. Building on a NN/LM MAR Planning Award, “Getting the (Healthy) Word Out: a Train-the-Trainer Approach for Nurses”, this project will create online tutorials and deliver both web-based and face-to-face instruction to unaffiliated nurses and health professionals at locations and times convenient to them. Focus will be on quality, free resources available on the web.

Participants will also learn how to access the collections of Rochester area libraries and be introduced to Loansome Doc, PubMed Central and other sources for full text articles. The \$30,000 award will provide funding for four laptop computers and mobile internet accounts, for training in locations where computers are not available. For the Library Instruction Leadership ACademy (LILAC) graduates (the first class), the party was a bitter-sweet ending to a program filled with challenges and rewards to all those involved (participants, committee members, presenters and observation librarians). At the event, each graduate presented a brief description of her upcoming final project which will encompass much of what was learned throughout the academy. Participants were also presented with certificates to reward all of the hard work they accomplished throughout the semester.

Though the academy has formally ended, it will continue on through several outlets. Some of the participants have formed lasting relationships with both committee members and presenters and will be collaborating with them on future projects. Several of them will also present at upcoming conferences including SUNYLA, NYLA and possibly ACRL. Finally, the academy members have agreed to meet socially once a month to continue the discussions started during this project. We envision this academy to be the start of many new exciting library instruction initiatives.
